ANT 767 Dissertation Residency Credit Grading Guidelines – approved October 2021

Students and advisors should meet at the start of each semester in which a student is enrolled in ANT 767 Dissertation Residency Credit in order to agree upon the goals for the semester which will support timely completion of the degree. A written description of the goals will be signed by the advisor and student and submitted to the DGS. Advisor and student will consult regularly to work towards the goals. A grade of S (Satisfactory) should be given for students who make substantial progress on the agreed upon goals for the semester. A grade of U (Unsatisfactory) should be given for students who do not make a good faith effort to meet the agreed upon goals for the semester. At the end of the Fall semester, faculty advisors should submit to the DGS a short summary of how their advisees enrolled in ANT 767 met the outlined goals for the course that semester. At the end of the Spring semester, this summary along with information about students' general dissertation progress will be presented during the annual graduate student review and recorded by the DGS at that time.
